What is the FGU?





- Founded in 1997 by the governments of Germany and France
- Financed in equal parts by both partner countries
- A network of 210 affiliated member universities in 144 cities in France, Germany and other countries

- Intensifying the cooperation between Germany and France in the fields of higher education and research
- Initiation, evaluation and financial support of Franco-German study and research programmes
- Promoting mobility and international career opportunities for students and early career researchers

Funding instruments at all levels

Study programmes:

 Integrated joint study programmes with double degree for Bachelor's and Master's level (bi- and trinational)

Research programmes:

- Cotutelle de thèse
- Franco-German Graduate Schools (DFDK/CDFA)
- Franco-German PhD programmes
- Scientific Events for Junior Researchers
- Franco-German Chairs (pilot project)



Scientific Events for Junior Researchers (workshops, summer schools)



- The FGU promotes events for **junior researchers** (PhD students and post-docs) aimed at supporting networking among researchers and developing Franco-German and international scientific dialogue
- Calls for applications are open to all disciplines
- Events should be for a minimum of two days and a maximum of four weeks → an individual event or a series
 of events are possible

Calls for applications:

- 1 general call for applications
- 2 specific calls for applications
 - European integration: new impetus for the 'European factory'
 - Artificial intelligence and its challenges for our society
- Application deadlines: 15 Mar, 15 Jun, 15 Oct

Scientific Events for Junior Researchers (workshops, summer schools)



Who can apply?

- French and German universities as well as non-university research institutes
- Inclusion of a third country also possible

Financial support includes:

- Depends on the length of the event and number of participants (between €2,000 and €15,000)
- Financial support includes: expenses for teaching/research assistants, mobility for participants, publicity costs

Franco-German Chairs (pilot project)



- Intensifying research and teaching in the Franco-German context
- Creating future-proof positions for young researchers and enabling the long-term transfer of Franco-German expertise

The creation of a Franco-German chair can include:

- The creation of a new chair in the field of Franco-German cooperation
- The (early) reappointment of an existing chair in the field of Franco-German cooperation

Who can apply?

- German and French universities in all academic fields
- A co-operation between a German and a French university → one university anchors the chair at its own institution
- Also young academics who wish to have a chair can apply, but with the support of a German and a French university

Franco-German Chairs (pilot project)



Application deadline: 30 June 2024

Funding period:

• 3 years, option to submit an application for extension

Financial support includes:

- 50,000 € annual funding amount for:
- Pro rata personnel costs, administrative costs, project-related infrastructure, publication costs, travel and accommodation costs, costs for communication
